<i>Date</i>	SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2022
<i>Time</i>	2 PM SHARP to 4:30 PM (Please arrive 15 minutes early to set up.)
<i>Conductor</i>	Matthew Otto
<i>Biography</i>	Matthew Otto is currently serving as Interim Artistic Director of the world-renowned Toronto Children's Chorus where he is also co-founder/director of the Toronto Youth Choir. He is a lecturer at U of T, teaching choral methods and leading the S/A Chamber Choir. Founder/artistic director of Incontra Vocal Ensemble, a project-based, professional-level chamber choir in Toronto, he is equally at home in the symphonic chorus realm: Matthew was the Associate Conductor of the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir and Pax Christi Chorale. He has worked as music director at several Toronto churches, most recently at Christ Church Deer Park. As a strong advocate for the choral arts, he has been the President of Choirs Ontario, a board member of Choral Canada, and founding member of the Bridge Choral Collective.
<i>Music notes</i>	The <i>Mass in A-flat</i> is one of Schubert's mature works and is in six movements. The composer explores subtle meanings in the text, through imaginative use of musical ideas that parallel the manipulation of musical parameter to expressive ends in his beloved <i>Lieder</i> .
